"Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, they are a new creation: The old has gone, the new is here!" - 2 Corinthians 5:17 Consider the butterfly. Fundraiser for Harriet Caldwell

As a College, we are asking the school community to come together and support Harriet and her family. Harriet is a Year 8 student here at Victory Christian College. She enjoys a variety of sporting activities including Basketball and Netball. She loves to spend time with her friends, family, and pets. Just over a month ago, Harriet was stretching at home, preparing to go to basketball training, felt a pop in her lower back and immediately felt her legs go numb and couldn't stand up. From Bendigo ER, she was transported to the Royal Children's Hospital, where after a full week of testing on the Neuro ward, it was discovered she had suffered a Spinal Cord Infarct



(Stroke). Spinal Cord Strokes in children are extremely rare, with only three cases seen at the Royal Children's Hospital over the last 20 years. We ask for you to join us in praying for miraculous healing for Harriet. She has begun her rehabilitation journey and remains in the Royal Children's Hospital, on her road to recovery. Due to the busy daily Rehab & OT schedule, Tim and Rhiann are required to be present and very hands-on with Harriet in the Rehab ward and are unable to run their mobile coffee business, Coffee Storm, to the capacity that they normally would. To support the family with ongoing living expenses and towards the purchase of specialty equipment that will be required to assist Harriet when she comes home, we are holding a special fundraising event on the last day of this term, **Friday 23rd June**. Students can come dressed in casual clothes, and wear something **Green**, Harriet's favourite colour. Homeroom teachers will be collecting money in Homeroom throughout Week 9, with the big fundraising push on the final day. Emergency Drills

Throughout the year, each school is required to complete emergency drills to rehearse our response to critical incidents. At VCC, we believe these drills are an important part of being prepared for potential risks. We make every effort to reflect on the drill and improve how we might approach possible events such as building fires or bushfires, intruder lockdowns or other threats. In Term One, the College ran a successful fire drill where staff and students responded appropriately and promptly. As the year continues, different drills will be scheduled.

We understand that emergency drills may produce mixed emotions from students and encourage families to discuss the positive aspects of practising our response. In classrooms, age-appropriate discussions will take place prior to any drills we believe need additional attention (e.g., a lockdown.)

Collection of Students During School Hours

Just a friendly reminder, if you are dropping your child/ren off at school after 8.50am, to drop children at the school office on arrival to sign in so we can mark them as onsite. Please do not use the Bus Zone on Senior School side to drop or pick children up between 8.30am and 4pm as this prevents busses from pulling in safely so children can get off and on. Alternatively, when collecting students during school hours, in line with our child protection policies, it is essential to please present at the Admin Office before collecting children. If possible, prior notice to both the office and your child's teacher would be of assistance to ensure ease of collection, and to avoid delays in getting to appointments etc.

SchoolTV – Mobile Phone Separation Anxiety



The use of mobile phones and technology in schools has been a highly debated topic internationally, including in Australia. Almost all states and territories in Australia have implemented full bans on mobile phones during class, recess, and lunch times, while allowing students to carry their phones during travel to and from school.

Critics argue that there is no evidence supporting the effectiveness of such bans, but this is a mischaracterisation. Studies have shown the positive impacts of mobile phone bans in schools. One study conducted in 2016, found that banning mobile phones led to an increase in student performance, with test scores improving by 6.4% of a standard deviation. Similar studies from Spain and Norway also supported these findings.

For parents concerned about mobile phone separation anxiety in their children, it is important to acknowledge it as a real issue and discuss the negative effects of phone addiction, such as sleep problems and mental health issues. Gradually introducing phone-free periods at home, setting clear expectations and boundaries, and modelling healthy behaviours can help your child cope. It is also crucial to establish a support network and seek professional help if needed. Implementing mobile phone bans in schools allow for better focus on teaching and learning, minimising distractions, and interruptions.

This Special Report will help address mobile phone separation anxiety and provide guidance on supporting your child's wellbeing during this transition period. We hope you take time to reflect on the information offered in this Special Report, and as always, we welcome your feedback.
